



- Goal is to minimize risks related to legal, data protection and geopolitical aspects






Published 07 november 2024

In order to address the serious security situation, the government has presented extensive reforms to increase security. The threat landscape against Sweden has changed, which places high demands on government agencies' information and cybersecurity work. The government has therefore decided on a new ordinance to increase security and cost-effectiveness in government agencies' IT operations.






# Current roadmap – high level



Many Swedish authorities still remain on Skype for Business – what they all have in common is that they are now looking for alternative solutions






- ”Choose protocol and interoperability before platform”

- Chat is in the same situation as email was before it was standardised on open protocols




